If you're interested in joining our Private Satellite Program, watch the informational slideshow on the website. After watching the presentation, please email psp@fremontchristian.com for an application. You may submit your application along with the \$40 application fee to the FCS Business Office (Fremont Christian School ATTN: PSP 4760 Thornton Ave. Fremont, CA, 94536) before July 31. All enrollment fees and paperwork must be completed and turned in within 1 week of acceptance, so please plan accordingly. Applications may be accepted after July 31st, however proof of enrollment at another school may be required. Please note that we do not accept new 11th or 12th grade students into our program.

After we receive your application, we will contact you for an interview where you will have the opportunity to ask any questions, as well as receive an overview of our program, and student/parent expectations.

If you are accepted and choose to join the PSP and your registration and tuition payment are complete, you will be contacted by your coordinator. Your coordinator will speak with you about following:

- Overview of all required forms: COS, attendance, report cards, and community service
- Access to the PSP website and the online PSP Handbook
- Advice on curriculum choices
- Overview of on-campus classes and activities

Our Responsibilities:

Your PSP Coordinator's commitment to you:

- To pray for your family
- To support your family in choosing curriculum, filling out the necessary paperwork and providing general support by answering questions, etc.
- Keep your student's cumulative file updated
- Make sure that your high school student is on track for graduation from FCS

Your Responsibilities:

FCS PSP Parent Requirements and Responsibilities:

- You must be a born-again believer and regularly attend a church in your community
- You are required to be HSLDA members
- You are responsible for choosing and obtaining all curriculum, setting goals, and evaluating your children's progress
- You are required to serve on a committee
- You are required to attend the quarterly meetings
- You are required to submit completed paperwork on time: Courses of Study, Attendance Records, Report Cards and returning or renewing library materials
- You are required to make timely payment of fees to both the PSP and FCS for on-campus classes and sports
- You are required to follow the guidelines stated in both the PSP and FCS handbooks

What We Offer:

- **Cumulative File Maintenance:** Our office staff keeps cumulative files up-to-date. We also file a homeschool affidavit so you don't have to.
- **Transcripts for High School:** FCS offers us an official transcript which can be sent to colleges when requested.

NWEA MAP Testing Grades K-12 Free of Charge

MAP Testing is a dynamic adaptive assessment that measures your students' achievement and growth in K–12 math, reading, language usage, and science. Use MAP Growth to understand how your K–12 students are performing and to inform your instructional strategies. This test can be proctored online from your home using your computer.

PSAT 8/9 Grades 8/9 \$14

The PSAT 8/9 tests the same skills and knowledge as the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT, and PSAT 10—in a way that makes sense for eighth and ninth graders. It measures what they're already learning, shows them whether they're on track for college, and lets them know where they need the most improvement. That means students have time to tackle these areas long before they take the SAT. Students over 13 can share their scores with Khan Academy® to create a personalized practice experience. It's the best way to prepare for other tests in the SAT Suite of Assessments. PSAT will be administered at Fremont Christian School by FCS proctors.

PSAT/NMSQT Grade 11 \$18

When you take the PSAT/NMSQT, you're automatically screened for the National Merit® Scholarship Program, an academic competition for recognition and scholarships. The PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9 are **not** considered for entry. PSAT will be administered at Fremont Christian School by FCS proctors.

PSAT 10 Grade 10 \$18

The PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10 are the same test, offered at different times of year. PSAT will be administered at Fremont Christian School by FCS proctors.

PRE-ACT Grade 10 \$18

Pre-ACT simulates the ACT testing experience within a shorter test window on all four ACT test subjects: English, math, reading and science. Results predict future success on the ACT test, and provide both current achievement and projected future ACT test scores on the familiar 1-36 ACT score scale. PSAT will be administered at Fremont Christian School by FCS proctors.

AP Various \$98/each

Advanced Placement is a program run by College Board (the makers of the SAT) that allows you to take courses right in your high school that can earn you college credit and/or qualify you for more advanced classes when you begin college. The AP **courses are designed to give you the experience of an intro-level college class while you're still in high school.** You can get college credit for the class if you can pass the AP exam. AP exams will be administered at Fremont Christian School by FCS proctors.

FCS PSP Resource Center

We have thousands of resources in our PSP Resource Center. At the on-campus meetings, you may browse and check out various curriculum materials as well as homeschool tips, test preparation and character training materials. In between meetings, you may also search specific materials using our online library, and by appointments with your coordinator.

Activities through PSP:

- **Annual Picture Day:** We have an annual school picture day for families enrolled in the PSP. Your student will receive a FCS student ID, and you as the parent-teacher have the option of taking a picture and receiving a teacher ID as well.
- **School Pictures are included in the Yearbook so we encourage all students and parents to have their pictures taken.** One of the benefits of the PSP is that we take school pictures every year with a professional photographer. This year our school pictures will be taken Thursday, September 4th on-campus at FCS.
- **Color Yearbook-** PSP families have the option of purchasing both the PSP yearbook and/or the FCS on-campus yearbook. The PSP yearbook is unique because every family is able to include a self-designed page showing their family's homeschool year. In addition, there are plenty of pages with different activities: field trips, events, co-ops, etc. Other features: school pictures by class, special pages for seniors, and sports teams.
- **Senior Graduation-PSP** - Our graduating PSP seniors have the opportunity to participate in the Fremont Christian Graduation ceremony at the end of every school year.
- **On-Campus Classes, Performance Groups, and Sports:** Our Jr. and Sr. High students are invited to take part in performance groups. 4th - 12th graders are able to participate in sports. High school students can also take on-campus classes at FCS. Additional fees and requirements apply.
- **On-Campus Events:** Our PSP students are invited to participate in some of the on-campus events including: Chapel, College Fair, Dances, Prom, and Graduation. Please read the stipulations set in the Parent Handbook.
